Rules of Hockey: use of the "Forehand Edge"

The following information is currently being circulated by the Hockey Rules Board to National Associations and Continental Federations: -

At its March 2006 meeting, the Executive Board agreed proposals for rules changes recommended by the Hockey Rules Board.

Most of the changes will apply from 1 January 2007 but one change was agreed for immediate implementation. It relates to use of the forehand edge of the stick to hit the ball hard. This action had already been referred to and prohibited as an interpretation of current rules but is now reinforced by a formal change to the rules.

This rule change is incorporated in the 2006 Rules of Hockey published on the FIH website (see page 8 of the rules available at

<u>http://www.worldhockey.org/vsite/vnavsite/page/directory/0,10853,1181-116516-117783-nav-list,00.html</u>). It will be fully integrated in the 2007/8 rules when they are published later in the year.

With regard to the 2007/8 rules, you will have seen in the announcement of Executive Board decisions that we are moving to a two-year cycle for changes to and publication of the Rules of Hockey. The next set of rules will therefore apply from 1 January 2007 until 31 December 2008. The text is currently in draft form and we plan formally to publish the 2007/8 rules before September this year. Copies will then be circulated to all National Associations and will also be available on the FIH website.

Video Umpire Coaching at WorldHockey events

The May 2006 version of the WHO magazine has already been published. This latest edition includes a report on the Video Analysis, being used to assist the Umpire Managers for

Umpire coaching purposes. This has been taking place at most of the recent World level events including both recent World Cup Qualifiers.

FIH Umpiring Committee

The FIH Umpiring Committee met in Rome (ITA) on Friday 5 and Saturday 6 May 2006. The meeting coincided with the final two days of the Women's World Cup Qualifier.

In this connection, we are sorry to report that Bob Gagel (RSA) has recently tendered his resignation from the Committee. He has been thanked for his many years of service to both the Committee and worldwide umpiring development with a personal letter from Peter Cohen, the Hon. Secretary General.

The FIH Umpiring Committee will also meet again during on Sunday 5 November 2006 in London, as part of the meeting schedule in conjunction with the FIH Congress which is scheduled for Saturday 11 November 2006.
